

JURASSIC WORLD TRAINEE SCRIPT

JURASSIC WORLD HANDLER: Hello, and congratulations on becoming one of Jurassic World's Dinosaur Handlers. In this video, we're going to go over the expectations of being a Dinosaur Handler, such as safety procedures, guest interactions, and, of course, the handling of Jurassic World's precious dinosaurs. Let's get started!

Being a dinosaur handler, you need to consider the safety of both the park's guests and the little dinosaurs that you would be handling. For starters, you will be handling either a baby raptor or a baby T-Rex. Before grabbing your scaly companion, you need to make sure that you're prepared and properly equipped.

While it is expected for our handlers to wear paleontologist-styled uniforms, we'd recommend that you wear steel-toed boots. The interactive pen that you would be in would be crawling with many little dinosaurs that would likely step or attack your foot. We also recommend that you wear strong leather gloves for handling your dinosaur companion. And to ensure that you don't die of heatstroke or sunburn, please make sure to wear a good amount of sunscreen, and a hat for extra protection. We also recommend having a little pack to carry your water bottle and dinosaur treats at all times.

With the park opening, we are expecting to receive a lot of guests who would be excited to see Jurassic World's dinosaurs. To ensure that your companion doesn't get overwhelmed with the attention, please make sure that only a limited amount of people approach them. We'd recommend at least 3 to 5 guests per interaction. As per protocol, guests can interact with your companion by

1. Petting the back of the dinosaur
and
2. Only two fingers on top of the head.

Don't let our guests anywhere near the mouth of your companion or else they'll likely lose a finger. Or two.

KID OR ANOTHER PERSON OFF-CAMERA: OUCH!!

And if a finger is lost, then shame on them because they should've known what they were getting into when they signed our park waiver.

Also, please make sure that you maintain a firm grip on your companion. We don't want to risk them escaping to who-knows-where and attacking who-knows-who and what. Simply hold them up like this, and (LIFT UP A BABY DINOSAUR ON SCREEN) voila! By holding them like this, they can't do anything but dangle their little legs and use their tiny front claws to rest on your

fingers. This is also a comfortable position for the baby dinosaurs, so they wouldn't be prone to attacking anything within their vicinity.

You can also give them a treat whenever they leave a guest unharmed. This positive reinforcement will teach them that it's good to not harm humans, and further strengthens their bond with you.

In an event where they do end up hurting someone, please don't harm or yell at the little dinosaur. By disciplining them harshly, you'd end up being seen as a threat. So, if you don't want to end up like Ned (CAMERA SHIFTS TO A DEAD BODY ON THE GROUND), just don't give them a treat and take them away from the interactive pen. Give them some time in their enclosure before going back out. And if your companion is still salty, then move on to a different dinosaur.

Here in Jurassic World, it is expected of us to follow safety protocols in times of natural disasters; such as earthquakes, tsunamis, that volcano exploding, and in rare cases, a predator running loose.

In an earthquake, simply maintain your ground when you're outside. Kneel down and stay down until you think the shaking is over. Once you think the shaking has stopped, immediately make your way to one of the nearest safe houses.

As for tsunamis and volcanoes, again, make your way to one of the nearest safe houses once you hear the warning drill.

In a rare case that one of our largest predators gets loose in the park, our security staff will escort you and everyone else within the area to a safe house. If you ever do encounter the escaped dinosaur, then pray and run as fast as you could until you could find shelter. Unless it's our infamous T-Rex, then you'll want to stand still for that. Again, this is a rare case to happen, so don't worry too much about it. Jurassic World is intent in avoiding the same mistakes that Jurassic Park has made. No need to worry about an escaped T-Rex or raptors or one of those freaky flying things to come after us. We're perfectly safe!

JURASSIC WORLD HANDLER: Hello, and welcome to Jurassic Park!

OFF-CAMERA: It's Jurassic World

JURASSIC WORLD HANDLER: Wait, it's a park? I thought you said it was Jurassic World.

BEEP AND SCENE CHANGE

JURASSIC WORLD HANDLER: (Reading contract/application) Oh my gosh, there IS a Jurassic World. And I work there!

OFF-CAMERA: Can we continue the training video?

JURASSIC WORLD HANDLER: Not till I finish reading my contract! Wait, you guys offer paid funeral services?

BEEP AND SCENE CHANGE

JURASSIC WORLD HANDLER: Here in Jurassic Park-

OFF-CAMERA: It's Jurassic World

JURASSIC WORLD HANDLER: (Pause for a moment, then gasp) Oh yeah! Right! Jurassic World! (Chuckle) Sorry, I'll get it next time.

BEEP AND SCENE CHANGE

JURASSIC WORLD HANDLER: (Holding a book) Good afternoon. My name is Russell, and I am a Wilderness Explorer.

OFF-CAMERA: You work for Jurassic World, not Disney World.

JURASSIC WORLD HANDLER: (Shocked) There's a Disney World too?!

BEEP AND SAME SCENE

JURASSIC WORLD HANDLER: (Still holding book) Good afternoon. My name is Lunch, and I am the next one to be eaten by Rexie the T-Rex. (Looks at cameraman) Is that better?

OFF-CAMERA: (waves camera up and down)

JURASSIC WORLD HANDLER: Okay, good. I'm not actually going to be T-Rex lunch, right?

OFF-CAMERA: (waves camera left and right)

JURASSIC WORLD HANDLER: Okay, sweet! Sorry, sometimes I forget that Jurassic World is "perfectly safe." It's not like the T-Rex and Velociraptors are going to escape like Jurassic Park.
